

Talking Chips
Responsibility: Freedom with Limitations

Instructions:

- Students are divided into groups of four or five.
- Each person is given a chip (or coin, etc.)
- The teacher reads out a question in class.
- Each group will share their ideas in groups.
- Every time a group member wants to share their idea, he or she must put his chip in the middle of the table.
- It is his or her turn to talk and everyone listens.
- When that person has done talking, another student puts his or her chip on the table.
- This goes on until every member has spoken.
- When all the groups are done, the teacher reads out the next question.

Example of questions:

Where do you get your everyday news from?

Do you believe everything you read in the media?

The media should just report facts. Do you agree? Why?

What is freedom of speech?

Should there be a limitation to freedom of speech?

Do you think the media is capable of inciting violence?
